Wenatchee River Salmon Festival brings back community day Sept. 23

Wenatchee, Washington – Swim on over to Rocky Reach Park and Discovery Center to celebrate Salmon Peoples 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 23. For the first time since 2019, community day is back for people of all ages to enjoy a full day of interactive games, art, storytelling, food and fun.

Visitors can journey through a Native American village and become immersed into a powerful, intertribal cultural experience. On Sept. 21-22, SalmonFest will become an outdoor classroom for about 1,500 third- and fourth-graders from around the region. The day-long field trip integrates grade-level curriculum in a meaningful, experiential way.

The event has been the recipient of multiple awards, including, "Best Children's Program", by the International Festivals and Events Association. The best part is, admission is free.
